**Bill Nye** is a man with a mission: to help foster

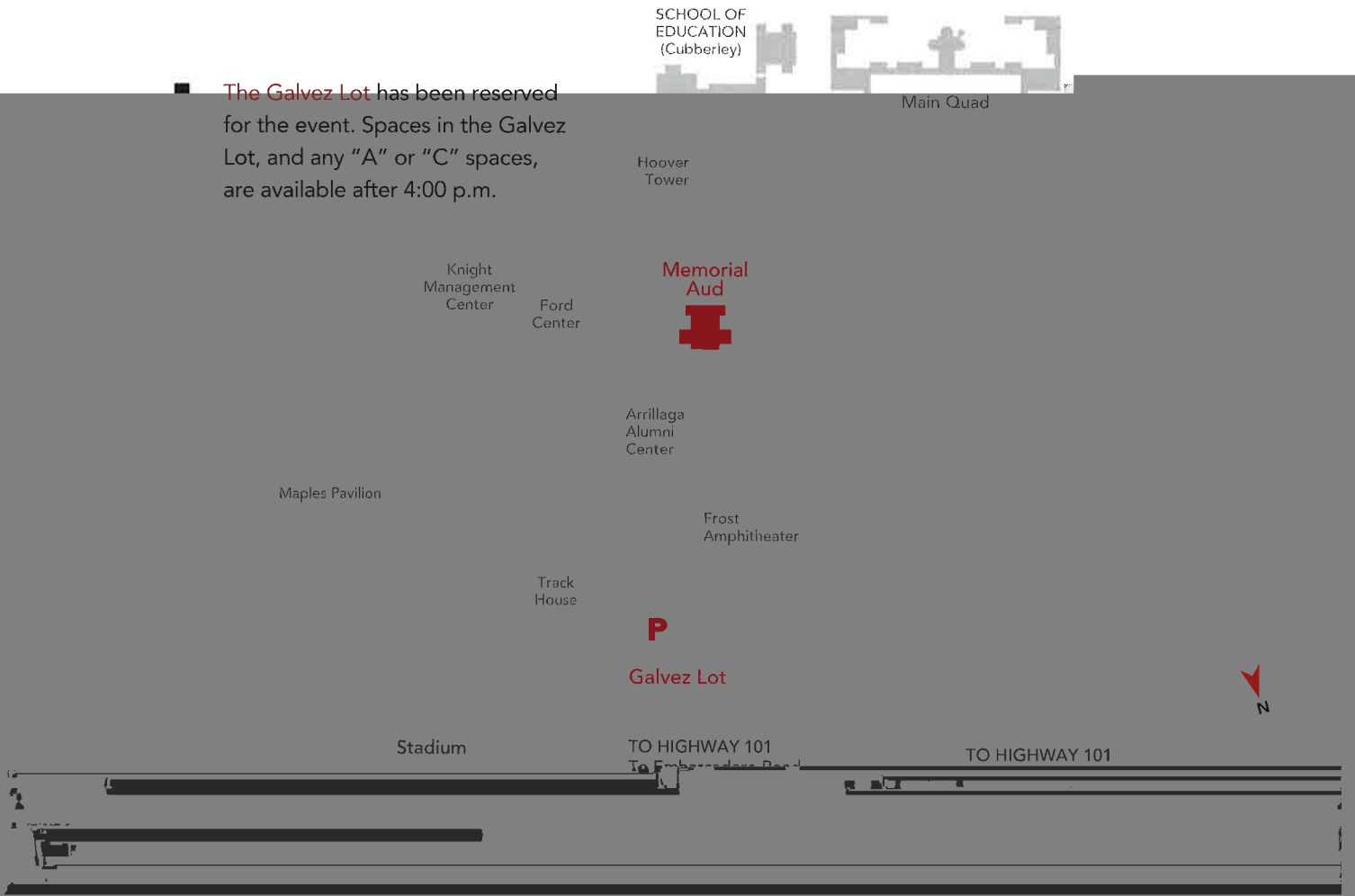

His fascination with science led him to Cornell University and a degree in Mechanical Engineering in 1977. Soon after, Boeing recruited him as an engineer. In Seattle, Nye began to combine his love of science with his flair for comedy, when he won the Steve Martin look-alike contest and developed dual careers as an engineer by day and a stand-up comic by night. In 1993, "Bill Nye the Science Guy®" was born, earning 19 Emmys in five years. Nye wrote his first book for a general audience, *Undeniable: Evolution and the Science of*
