WHEREASCalifornia is recognizing May 10th as National Fentanyl Awareness apapportunity to educate the community about the dangers of fentanyl; and

WHEREASdrug traffickers masproduce fake or counterfeit pills in an effort to falsely market them as legitimate prescriptionpills, resulting in deceptions and threats to communities throughout the nation and locally; and

WHEREAS he Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) has observed a dramatic rise in the number of counterfeit pills containing at least two milligrams of fentanyl, which is considered a deadly dose; and

WHEREA, Sour out of 10 pills with fentanyltested by the DEAcontain a potentially lethal dose; and

WHEREAS he number of law enforcementateized counterfeit pills with fentanyl has increased by nearly 502 percent since 2019; and

WHEREAS noonentleafiei 9ptil 9ch 200 been mitterfreitlie eit Iroall 50 states and the District of Columbia and

WHEREASentanylhasalsobeendetectedin drugssuchasheroin and cocaine and

WHEREASIN 2020, more than 93,000 drug overdose deaths in the US were from fentanyl or another syntheticopioid. For the 12-month period ending October 2021, more than 105,000 Americans died due to drug-

WHEREASover the last 20 years, drugduced deaths among those 15 to 35 years of age have increased six-fold, largely driven by the increase in fentanyl drugs. Fentianvydlved deaths are the fastest growing among 14 to 23/year-olds; and

WHEREAS 2020, drug overdose and poisoning deaths for personts 1148 years of age grew by 169 percent, more than three times as fast as the national rate and faster than any otheyrefaveage group; and
