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Education Code (EC) 1620 requires that on or before July 1 of each fiscal year, the OYA Governing Board shall hold a public hearing on the OYA Budget. The public hearing shall be held prior to the adoption of the budget. Education Code (EC) 52068 (b)(1) also requires the public hearing for the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) shall be held at the same meeting as the public hearing required by Section 1620 for the proposed budget.

The OYA Budget in 2022-23, total projected revenues are approximately \$4.98M and projected expenditures are approximately \$4.98M.

Pursuant to Education Code (EC) Section 47606.5(a), requires the governing body of a charter school to hold a public hearing to adopt a Local Control Accountabilit

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### Background

On March 17, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order N-29-20 that suspended the teleconferencing rules set forth in the Brown Act enabling legislative bodies to meet remotely. On September 16, 2021, the Governor signed AB 361 authorizing a legislative body subject to the Brown Act to continue to meet remotely using teleconference without compliance with the Brown Act teleconference rules if certain conditions are followed. On [September 21, 2021](#), the County Health Officer issued a recommendation, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein, that public bodies continue to meet remotely. On November 30, 2021 and June 2, 2022 the Opportunity Youth Academy Governing Board passed Resolution No. 2289-5 authorizing virtual board meetings pursuant to AB 361.

### Student Impact

The County Health Officer has recommended that legislative bodies continue to meet remotely to promote social distancing as one means to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission. The Opportunity Youth Academy Governing Board has an important governmental interest in protecting the public health, safety, and welfare of those who participate in meetings of the various legislative bodies during COVID-19 and ensuring that all members of the public can participate safely in meetings of legislative bodies.

California Education Code sections 41507 and 41572 require each school to consolidate all school plans for programs funded through the Consolidated Application and Reporting System, into the School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA).
