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There is consensus to go with scenario #7, which is to equalize rates of different SELPAs and eliminate the MOUs. However, it was noted that SCCOE Special Ed program costs/expenses will increase with the elimination of the offsets that are done through MOU 1.

A countywide SELPA Base Rate meeting will be held this March to determine the final scenario and whether it should be a multivear rollout so that districts impacted by the shift can adjust, or if implementation should be carried out this 2020 school yer. A recommendation will be presented to the SELPA Executive Council in April.

- A. SELPA Director Updates
 - 1) Downtown College Prep El Camino MS and El Primero HS request for early release from SELPA IV SCCOE and SELPA IV support the release of DCP El Camino MS and El Pltimesond & d, however, that with the release of DCP Camino MS and El Primero, they run the risk of not belonging to any SELPA.
 - CDE Compliance and Monitoring Activities coprovided an update on which districts are in differentiated assistance, significant disproportionality, and requiring a Special Education Plan (SEP). SEP approvals will be sent out by CDE in March.
 - 3) Local Plan-SELPA is currently working on updating Section B (Governance) of the Local Plan. Revised templates for the other sections will be released by Content A study session will be held with districts to finalize the Local Plan for submission to CDEner30, 2021.
